PURCHASE YOUR 2024 SNOWMOBILE TRAIL PERMIT

Michigan's state-designated trails are open Dec. 1 through March 31. Trail permits for the 2023-24 season are available now and enable you to ride authorized, state-designated trails and thousands of miles of public roads.

Permits can be purchased:

- Online through <u>eLicense</u> (your sticker will be mailed to you within 7-10 days).
- Online with the Michigan Snowmobile & ORV Association.
- In person at a number of **DNR license agents and dealers**



FREE SNOWMOBILE WEEKEND

The DNR has announced a free snowmobiling weekend.

The free weekend, which lands on **Feb. 9-11**, comes as a result of Public Acts 55 and 56, passed by the Legislature in 2022. During these two days, snowmobilers can operate their machines without the need for a snowmobile registration or trail permit.
