McBROOM GIVES UPDATE ON NEW LAWS

PUBLIC ACT 6 OF 2022 creates the first-time homebuyer savings account to provide a tax deduction for contributions and interest earned. These accounts will provide an opportunity to save and grow funds for homeownership in Michigan.

PUBLIC ACT 34 OF 2021 strengthens services for military veterans in their home communities by revising criteria for county veteran service funds, helping local offices across the state deliver services.

PUBLIC ACT 31 OF 2021 allows veterans, spouses and dependents seeking benefits to be interviewed in a closed session of a county veteran services board meeting so that their personal information is protected.


PUBLIC ACTS 24, 25 AND 26 OF 2021 create reciprocal licensing and waive licensing fees for veterans, military and members of other uniformed services and their dependents. By allowing Michigan to recognize comparable licenses from other states, military and veteran dependents can more easily resume their careers when moving to a new state in support of a military spouse or dependent.

PUBLIC ACT 23 OF 2021 allows current military personnel, veterans, and their dependents to waive costly licensing fees for occupational licenses issued by another state, easing the process to get licensed in Michigan.
