Dear Chair DeBoyer,

Following a recent <u>audit</u> by the Office of the Auditor General that found the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services failed to protect the rights of psychiatric patients, I would like to express my support for a committee hearing to review these findings.

I <u>requested</u> the audit after <u>hearing tragic accounts</u> from former patients and families with loved ones treated at the former Hawthorn Center. The OAG's findings confirmed serious concerns within the Office of Recipient Rights, including:

- Nearly 30% of sampled complaints alleging abuse, neglect, serious injury or death were not retrieved or acted on in a timely manner.
- More than 10% of sampled complaints lacked an ORR date stamp, making it impossible to determine whether action was timely.
- Video and audio systems at state psychiatric hospitals were often missing or not working.
- ORR had no process to monitor state psychiatric hospitals' incident reports, which could have led to undetected and/or unreported rights violations.

The Legislature must act to strengthen oversight and ensure accountability for those responsible for protecting vulnerable patients in the state's care. Therefore, I formally request a hearing to address the glaring failures within MDHHS.

I would gladly provide additional information or testimony before your committee.
